FUNERAL OF MRS. FRANCIS NEWMAN –

Yesterday (Friday) the funeral took place of the late **Mrs. NEWMAN**, widow of the late Mr. Francis NEWMAN (county surveyor), and younger daughter of the late Mr. Edward WATTS, of Cowes. The chief mourners were Mr. Randolph POLLARD (great nephew), Mr. James NEWMAN, Sandown (brother-in-law), Major J. ELLERY, Mr. C. LANGDON, and Mr. S. COCKS. Mr. Edgar WHITTAKER, Southampton (cousin), and the Rev. W. J. Hermann NEWMAN, Vicar of East Deane, were unavoidably prevented from attending. Mrs. NEWMAN, who has been an invalid for some years, passed away peacefully on Sunday at the age of 80. Several friends, not knowing Mrs. NEWMAN's wish to have no flowers, sent wreaths, which were buried with her, an especially beautiful wreath being that from the members of the East Medina Lodge of Freemasons (No. 175). The first part of the service was held at the Parish Church, the Vicar (the Rev. A. G. ROBINSON) officiating, assisted by the Revs. C. L. BLAKE and W. E. VANDELEUR. The committal sentences at the graveside were read by the Rev. W. E. VANDELEUR. Among those present were Ald. E. GROVES, J. P., and Messrs. W. H. RIDDETT, J. P., H. DURRANT, H. J. OSBORNE, E. R. OSBORNE, F. F. FARRAND, and W. H. LONG. The coffin was of polished elm with brass fittings, and bore the inscription "**Ann Elizabeth NEWMAN**, died May 17, 1908, aged 80 years." Messrs. LANGDON were the undertakers.
