

**THE LATE MR. THOMAS DASHWOOD. J.P.**

A resolution of regret of Mr. **Thomas DASHWOOD**, J.P., was passed at the meeting of Ryde Borough Justices on Monday. The Mayor (Ald. A.J. COOMBES) presided over the Bench, and he was supported by Mr. H.H. POLLARD. C.A., Mr. W.H. RIDDETT, Mr. Michael MAYBRICK, Mr. F.G. FLUX and Mr. E.T. MINTER. The resolution which was read in Court by the Mayor before the commencement of the police business, was as follows: "That we as Justices of the peace for the borough of Ryde, desire to express our deep sense of the great loss which the Bench and the Borough has sustained by the reason of the death of an esteemed colleague, Mr. Thomas DASHWOOD, J.P., who for the past 38 years has been on the Commission of Peace for this borough, and that the Clerk be instructed to write to Mrs. DASHWOOD. Conveying our sincere sympathy with her and her family in their sorrow." At a meeting on Tuesday of the General Committee of the Ryde Y.M.C.A., it was resolved to perpetuate the memory of the late President's connection with the Association by hanging a large portrait in the rooms in Lind-Street. The late Mr. DASHWOOD'S great and lengthy services to the Association are also to be placed on record in the minutes. The work of Mr. Thomas DASHWOOD in connection with this flourishing branch of the Association was by no means confined to his occupancy of the presidential chair, from which recently he had been compelled to frequently absent himself. He was one of the founders with Sir George WILLIAMS and others of the branch, and was its first honorary secretary, while the noble building in Lind-Street is lasting tribute to his position as hon. Architect.
