**DEATH OF ME. H. E. CALL**

It is with very deep regret that we record the death of Mr. Harold Edgar CALL, which occurred on Sunday at his residence, 3 Gravelthorp Mount, Halton, Leeds, from abscess on the brain. Mr. CALL, who was but 28 years of age, was early in the present year appointed to the sub-editorship of the *Leeds Daily News*. He was a most promising journalist, and was formerly on the staff of the *Thanet Advertiser*. He was an excellent fellow, and his good qualities made for him numbers of friends wherever he went. Mr. CALL did admirable service on the *Lichfield Mercury*, the *Bath Daily Herald*, and the *Warwickshire Advertiser*. He held office as chairman of the Warwickshire branch of the Hearts of Oak Benefit Society, and took a keen interest in and wrote with authority on football and cricket.

In October 1892, Mr. CALL was married to Miss Jessie Katherine GARRETT, of Brinstead, Isle of Wight.

The funeral took place in London yesterday (Friday).
