OFFICER'S DEATH AT RYDE

We regret to record the death at the age of 45, of Major **Henry Crewe GODLEY**, D.S.O., of the Northamptonshire Regiment. Major GODLEY had been stationed at Colchester until recently, but becoming seriously ill he was removed to a nursing institution at Ryde, where he died on Tuesday last. The deceased soldier saw active service with his regiment during the late Boer war.

The funeral took place to-day (Friday). The body was conveyed to the cemetery in an open hearse, the coffin being hidden beneath a profusion of beautiful wreaths. On each side of the hearse walked four men of the deceased's regiment, wearing crepe bands upon their arms.
