Lonely Widow's Death.- The circumstances of a lonely widow's death were inquired into by the Deputy-Coroner (R. E. A. WEBSTER, Esq.) on Thursday. She was Mrs. Mary Gertrude GRAHAM, aged 73, widow of Mr. John Duncan GRAHAM, who was found dead in her flat at 2b, Belmont, George-street, on Tuesday. On November 5th the Mother Superior of St. Cecelia's Convent received a letter from deceased stating that she had bled from the nose and a fall on the stairs had shaken her.

Percy E. LANGDON said that on November 10th Mr. LEGG, a tenant of the flat, informed him that nothing had been heard of Mrs. GRAHAM. With a master key he entered deceased's flat and found her lying dead in the kitchen.

Dr. Spencer CHURCHILL said death was due to cerebral haemorrhage. She probably died on the previous Saturday.

The verdict was "Death from natural causes."
