OBITUARY. – We regret to record the death of Mr Charles Henry WHEATLEY, of the Bays, near Ryde, which took place on Wednesday the 11th inst. The funeral was on Monday last, the first part of the service being taken at Swanmore Church by the vicar, the Rev. W.F.J. HANBURY, assisted by the Rev. MORRANT, both of whom also officiated at the Cemetery, where the interment took place. The body was enclosed in a metallic shell with outer casket of polished oak, with raised lid and massive brass ring handles, and was conveyed to the church in an open car followed by six carriages and pairs.

A very large number of really beautiful floral tributes were sent by many sorrowing relatives and friends, but two wreaths only were placed upon the coffin, one from the widow and the other from deceased's little children. The massive brass plate bore the following engraved inscription: "Charles Henry WHEATLEY, Died March 11th, 1903, aged 44 years."

The mourners were – Mrs WHEATLEY (wife), Miss Gladys WHEATLEY (daughter), Mr. J. WHEATLEY (brother), Mrs DEAN (sister-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. Lee SMITH, Mr. DEAN, Mr. Johnson WATSON, Mr. WATSON, jun., Dr. GLENN, of Croydon, Miss DEAN, Mr. C.W. DEAN, Mr. DOUGHTY, Mr. TULLOCH, Dr. K.W. Ingleby MACKENZIE (deceased's medical attendant), Mr. RUSSELL and the servants of the house, and three nurses from the Sherwood Home.

The whole of the arrangements were admirably carried out by Messrs PURNELL and PURNELL, of Ryde.
