The Late **Miss Sybil READY**. - Miss Sybil READY, who died at Waxham House, High Park-road, on Friday week, was a much respected resident of many years standing. She was the third daughter of the late Rev. Henry READY, M.A., rector of Waxham-cum-Palling, Norfolk, and the last surviving child of a family of 10. She came to live with her aunt, the late Miss MAXWELL, in Belvedere-street when not very old. Her main interests were church work and painting. For a long time she attended Holy Trinity Church, where she conducted a Bible Class for girls, and when later she removed to St. John's parish she continued this work and only a few days before her passing had conducted the usual weekly gathering. Miss READY was a clever water-colour painter and had exhibited at the I.W. Art Society's shows. Another recreation was chess, a game of which she was no mean exponent. A well-informed and most entertaining personality, she will be much missed by many friends. The late Viscount MILNER was her cousin, not Lord METHUEN as we were mistakenly informed last week.

The funeral service was at St. John's, Oakfield, on Monday, when the Rev. E.T.H. ROYDS officiated. Mr. E.S. SHEPPARD (organist) played "Blest are the departed" (SPOHR), "O rest in the Lord," and GOUNOD's "Ave Verum."
