MRS. P. FISHER

The funeral of Mrs. P. FISHER, a former Ryde resident, who died at an Oxford Hospital suddenly after an operation, took place at the Congregational Church, Ryde, on Monday.

Mrs. FISHER was the wife of Mr. Percy FISHER who came from Eastbourne, his native town, to work at HILL's Stores before the war. Mrs. FISHER, who was at that time Miss GALE, was then working at a shop called Denny's in Ryde, which has since closed.

They were married at Croydon, Miss GALE's home town, and came back to live in Ryde.

Both were prominent members of the Congregational Church in George-street and sang in the choir.

Mr. FISHER took a great interest in the Church Guild and later became a deacon. He later served in the war and left Ryde soon after demobilisation.

He is now managing a drapery store at Wallingford, Berkshire.

Mrs. FISHER, who leaves one son besides the widower, was 61 years old.

The service was conducted by the Rev. E. H. LEWIS, of Elmfield Congregational Church.

The mourners were Mr. P. FISHER (husband), Mr. D. P. FISHER (son), and Miss N. FISHER (sister-in-law).

Also present at the church were Mr. W. E. GALLEY (the choir master), Mr. W. R. TAYLOR, Mr. H. G. JOLLIFFE, Mr. E. F. MORRIS, Mr. E. JOLLIFFE, Mr. W. R. PINCHARD (the church secretary), Mrs. POLLARD, Mrs. WEALTHY, members of the choir of Mrs. FISHER's day, and many friends of the church.
