

Death of Mrs. S. WHITE.- The death occurred at St. Mary's Hospital, Newport, on Saturday after a long illness, of Mrs. **Susan WHITE**, aged 76, of 11 Alfred Street. The widow of William WHITE, who died in 1946, she came to the town from Bristol in 1910. She was a member of the Mothers' Union for many years, being first associated with St. Michael's branch and later with that at All Saints' Church, where her elder son (Mr. A. WHITE) is verger. The coffin was received at All Saints' Church on Monday, when Compline was said by the Vicar (Canon A. CORY), who was the celebrant at a requiem and he conducted the burial office on Tuesday. Mr. W. L. REED (organist) accompanied the hymns "There is a land of pure delight" and "Ye holy angels bright." The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. A. WHITE and Mr. and Mrs. W. WHITE (sons and daughters-in-law), Mrs. E. WILLIAMS (sister-in-law), also representing Mr. E. WILLIAMS (brother-in-law), and Miss J. WILLIAMS (niece), Mr. E. JAMES (brother-in-law, also representing Mrs. JAMES (sister-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. J. TITE (cousins), and Mrs. E. LANE. The parochial church council were represented by Mr. A. J. ARCHER (people's warden) and the Mothers' Union by Mrs. A. CORY (enrolling member). The interment was at Ryde Cemetery, and the wreaths included one from the Mothers' Union.
