DEATH OF MR. T.H. HALSTED –

It is with deep regret that we record the death at the residence of his son at Emsworth, on Wednesday, of Mr. **Thomas Henry HALSTED**, of Hillsborough, Melville-street. Mr. HALSTED, who was 76, had been in failing health for six months, and the end came in his sleep after he had taken to his bed for two days. A native of the town, Mr HALSTED had spent all his life here, and was highly respected by all who knew him. After acting as manager for the late Mr George GODFREY, draper, of High-street, he took over the business many years ago and at length retired. For nearly 60 years he had been associated with the Wesleyan Church. He had held the office of trustee and chapel steward for some years and in other branches of church work had rendered long and valuable service. For three years from 1920 he represented the East Ward on the Town Council and he was a popular member of the Bowling Club. Deep sympathy will be felt for his two daughters and son, his wife have predeceased him four years ago. The remains will be brought to the town for burial today (Saturday), the first part of the service being at the Wesleyan Church.
