OBITUARY MR. A. J. NEWNHAM

The death occurred on Friday at 57 Arthur-street, Ryde, of Mr. **Alexander James NEWNHAM**, at the advanced age of 91.

A native of Shanklin, Mr. NEWNHAM was for over half a century a master builder, engaged in construction in many parts of the Island. For 34 years he lived in Ryde.

Mr. NEWNHAM married a Ryde girl, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. TILLEY, who both had the distinction of being ordained ministers of the Methodist Church. Four sons and one daughter are left. They are Bert NEWNHAM (Canada), Messrs. Fred and Ernest NEWNHAM (Ryde), Mr. Lewis NEWNHAM (Shanklin), and Mrs. H. T. DIBBENS, with whom her father had been living.

The funeral took place yesterday (Wednesday), the service at the house being taken by the Rev. E. S. WILLIAMSON.

NB: It has been noted that Mr NEWNHAM was usually known as Alex or Alexander, but his birth registration and marriage gave his full name as, **Ernest Alexander James NEWNHAM**.
