MR. A. J. BARTLETT

Mr. **Alfred John BARTLETT**, who as an instructor at Osborne House taught King George VI and the Duke of Windsor the art of navigation during their cadetship, died at his home 13 Nelson-street, Ryde on Monday.

Mr. BARTLETT was born in Ryde sixty-eight years ago, and was the second son of the late Capt. H. BARTLETT, of Ryde, who was for some years on the *s.s. Prince of Wales*.

A member of the Royal Navy, Mr. BARTLETT retired at the age of forty, but rejoined the Royal Naval Reserve when the Great War came. He was one of the survivors of the *H.M.S. Alcatraz*. Mr. BARTLETT was in charge of one of the ship's boats that was saved.

For the last six years he has lived with his sister, Miss J. BARTLETT in Ryde.

Mr. BARTLETT leaves one brother, Mr. H. BARTLETT, in Ryde, and five sisters, Mrs. L. TOMLINS, Mrs. R. WOOD, Mrs. A. JAMES, Mrs. M. LOVE, and Miss J. BARTLETT.

The funeral will be at the Cemetery at 3 o'clock on Friday.
