FUNERAL OF MR. HUGH MEARES

The funeral took place on Tuesday of Mr. **Hugh MEARES**, M.A., whose death occurred at his residence, Millfield, on Thursday of last week. The deceased gentleman, who was in his 82nd year, was held in the utmost respect in the town. He was son of the late John MEARES, of Plas. Llanstephan, Carmarthanshire. He had been ailing for some time. The clergy officiating were the Rev. Arthur M'CHEANE (minor canon of St. Paul's), great nephew of deceased, and the Vicar of Ryde (the Rev. Hugh Le FLEMING. The coffin was a plain casket of oak with heavy raised lid and brass furniture, the breastplate being inscribed: "Hugh MEARES, Esq., M.A., bor Aug 4th 1834, died Dec 2nd 1915." The

mourners were: Miss Queenie MEARES, Capt. Aubrey MEARES, D.S.O., R.E., Major Mervyn MEARES, R.A., Miss E. M. MEARES, Mr. A. L. MEARES, Capt. J. N.I MEARES, Mr. F. GREEN, Capt. H. P. MEARES, R.A., Miss MEARES, Miss Pamela MEARES, Mr. O. MEARES, Major L. RODNEY, R.I.R., Nurse HICKS, Mrs. RYALL, and the servants at Millfield. Amongst those present at the Cemetery were General FETHERSTONHAUGH, C.B., Mr. G. R. BRIGSTOCKE, C.C., Mr. P. THELLUSSON, J.P., Mr. P. Craven HALL, Capt. BURT, R.N., and Dr. D. J. DAVIS. The funeral arrangements were carried out by Messrs HANSFORD, Cross-street, Ryde.
