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OCTOGENARIAN'S DEATH –

An inquest was held at the Westward Nursing Home, on Saturday afternoon by the Deputy Coroner (F.A.JOYCE, Esq.,) into the circumstances of the death of **Emily LAMBERT**, 86, who had been a patient for the past two years. Evidence was given by Mary FRANCIS, night nurse, and Edith GENTLE, sister-in-charge, to the effect that deceased had sustained a fall while getting out of bed on the night of February 26<sup>th</sup> to reach her false teeth, as a result of which she broke her left arm. Her death occurred on Friday evening, March 11<sup>th</sup> from shock, accelerated by old age. Medical evidence was given by Dr. J.PRIDMORE, and a verdict of death from shock was recorded.

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
