NAVAL OBITUARY

Captain Henry Benjamin Wyatt, 1855, on the Retired H.I.K. List died at Ryde, Isle of Wight, on the 11th June, aged 77. He entered the Navy, 1803, a Midshipman of the Unicorn, and served in her boats at the capture of the French privateer Tape-à-Bord, in 1805. Served on shore with the Army at the storming of Monte Video, and assault upon Beunos Ayres, 1807; and took an active part at the attack on the French fleet in Aix Roads, 1809. He was made a Lieutenant on the 3rd July, 1808, and served in Walcheren expeditions as Lieutenant of the Magnet. He afterwards joined the Ruby, and saw much service against the Danish gunboats in the Baltic and Belts; and was made Commander, 18th Sept., 1815, and had not been employed subsequently.
