DEATH OF MISS **BARRY** –

A life-long resident of the town passed away on Tuesday in the person of Miss **Eleanor Maud BARRY**, of The Chestnuts, Ratcliffe-avenue. Miss BARRY, who was 70 years of age, succumbed to an illness which had extended over a considerable period. She was very well known and greatly respected, her efforts on behalf of the general good of the community being undertaken without any effort for popularity. A cause in which she was particularly keen and to which she gave loyal and devoted service was that of St. Michael's Church, where the first part of the funeral service and vespers of the dead took place on Friday, to be followed by a requiem mass and funeral today (Saturday). Miss BARRY was for some years a manager of the St. John's Schools, Oakfield, definite religious education being a subject she had very much at heart.
