**THE LATE MR. BERNARD J. MARVIN**

We sincerely regret that another familiar and respected townsman has passed away since our last issue ---that of Mr. **Bernard J. MARVIN**, of Union-street, of the well-known firm of auctioneers and estate agents (Messrs. E. MARVIN and Sons ). Although Mr. MARVIN had been suffering from heart affection during the past fortnight, he was able to get about, and the end was quite sudden and unexpected. He was out on Thursday, and early on Friday morning, he was seized with a pain in the chest, and after walking round the room sat down and immediately expired. Sincere sympathy is felt for the widow and family so suddenly bereaved. For many years he was a regular attendant of St. Michaels, Swanmore, and took a great interest in the church. He was 65 years of age.

The funeral took place on Monday, the service being held at All Saints Church. The officiating clergy were the Rev. W.F. HANBURY, the Rev. C.R. ALLEN and the Rev. W.H. WOODIN, who met the funeral procession at the door. The hymns were, "When our heads are bowed with woe," and "Now the labour's task is o'er."
