DEATH AND FUNERAL OF MISS PAKENHAM-MAHON.

We regret to record the death of Miss Florence PAKENHAM-MAHON, which occurred after a painful illness, cheerfully borne, on Friday last, at Westbrook, near Ryde. The deceased was well known for her kindly disposition, and a large circle of friends greatly mourn her loss. Her mother and her sister left some two or three weeks ago for the south of France, and deceased had made all arrangements to join them before Christmas but illness prevented.

The funeral took place on Thursday afternoon, at the Ryde Cemetery, the Rev. H. EWBANK (late vicar of St John's) officiating. The body was enclosed in a sanitary metallic shell, with an outer massive polished oak casket, with panelled sides and raised lid, and fitted with handsome brass stirrup ring handles. It was conveyed on an open car, the casket as well as the car was covered with the lovely floral tributes. Mrs PAKENHAM-MAHON's carriage conveyed the principal mourners, viz, Capt. PAKENHAM-MAHON (brother), Mrs FOSTER (sister), Mr FOSTER (brother-in-law). The coachman and Mr HAGGET, the valued and confidential family butler, also attended. In the next carriage were deceased's maid, and the servants of the household. Then followed; Mr G.H.OGLANDER, in his carriage; also the carriages of Lady SUTTON and Mr George HUTT,

Amongst others attending in the Church and at the Cemetery, were: Mr E. RICH, (deceased's esteemed medical attendant), Mr and Mrs J.N. HATHAWAY, Gen FETHERSTONHAUGH, Lieut.Col MORETON, the Rev A. KINGSTON, M.A., Mr A. GUINNESS, M.A.LEBOUVIER, and many others. The grave was a brick one, lined with evergreens and white crysanthemums. A plain but massive brass breastplate bore the engraved inscription: "Florence PAKENHAM-MAHON, born March 11th 1856; died December 7th, 1900."
