RAILWAY EMPLOYEE'S FUNERAL –

The funeral of Mr. **W.T.NEWNHAM**, of St. John's-wood-road, who for 14 years was in the service of the Joint Railway Companies as booking clerk, took place on Saturday. He was held in the highest esteem by the staff, and his death, at the early age of 29, after a short illness from influenza and pneumonia, came as a great shock to his many friends. The interment took place in the Cemetery. In addition to the relatives there were present Mr. G.H.FRENCH, station master, and representatives of the staff of the Joint Railway Companies, Mr. F.W.WOODS, of the Railway Clerks Association (of which the deceased was a member), and Mr. A.ANDREWS, J.P., C.C., representing the Ryde Pier Company. Among the large floral tributes were included those sent by the staff at Ryde Esplanade and Ryde Pier-head, the Railway Clerks Association, the Ryde

Pier Company, and the Police. Deceased leaves a widow and a daughter, for whom the greatest sympathy is felt. The funeral arrangements were in the hands of Mr. H.TAYLOR, Green-street.
