**DEATH OF MR. JAMES CHIVERTON**

We very much regret to state that Mr. **James CHIVERTON**, an old and respected inhabitant of Ryde, passed away last Sunday. He had been ailing for a week or so previously, but it was not considered a serious illness, and death coming so suddenly at the last was a great shock to his family, with whom much sympathy is felt. Mr. CHIVERTON came to Ryde many years ago, and started in business as a wine merchant in Union Street, but subsequently became the manager for the Bodega Company. His genial and kindly manners made him many friends, and he will be missed by a very large circle. The funeral took place on Wednesday afternoon. The coffin (which was of unpolished oak with brass mountings and was covered with floral mementoes) was taken to the Parish Church, the service being conducted by the Rev. G.O. BALKELY and the Rev.
