DEATH AND FUNERAL OF MR. JAMES HENRY GRIMES

We regret to announce the death on Sunday week at his home, The Vineries, Upton-road, of Mr. **James Henry GRIMES.** Mr. GRIMES, who was 76 years of age, was especially well known to the older generation, by whom he was greatly respected and esteemed. He possessed many sterling qualities, and, although he was not one to exhibit them on the surface of his nature, those who enjoyed his intimate friendship knew and appreciated the depth of his sincerity and the interest and support which he gave to matters with which he became associated. He was a member, for many years and at one time chairman of the Asheys Parish Council, a member of the Horticultural Society, and of the

Philharmonic Society. For a long period he was a valued chorister at the Parish Church, and in later years served in the office of sidesman. His wife predeceased him three years ago.

The funeral took place on Wednesday of last week, the first part of the service being held at the Parish Church, conducted by Canon G.A. JOHNSTONE. The mourners were Mr. T.E. GRIMES (brother), Mrs. HOLLISS (sister), Mr. and Mrs. W.R. TAYLOR (brother-in-law and sister), Mrs. HAVELOCK (sister), Mrs. T. JAMES (sister-in-law), Messrs. T. JAMES and J. and W. CAWTE (nephews), Messrs. A. HAVELOCK and A. and W. GRIMES (cousins), Mr. A. DIMMICK (successor in business), Messrs. PRISMALL, PHILIPS, and S. HUCK (employees), and members of the Horticultural Society and the Ashey Parish Council. The interment was at the Cemetery and the coffin was covered with choice flowers, which included tributes from the Horticultural Society and the Ashey Parish Council.
