## DEATH OF MR. W. R. HOGG

We regret to record the death of Mr. **William HOGG**, father of Mr. S. HOGG, Newsagent, who was a postmaster for 22 years, which business is carried on by his daughter, Mrs. READ. He passed away at his residence "Inglefield," George-street, on Monday evening, in his 85<sup>th</sup> year. Mr. HOGG who is well described as one of Ryde's grand old men, was well-known and respected all over the Island, and was photographer to the late Queen Victoria for over forty years when connected with the now defunct firm of HUGHES and MULLINS. He had lived all his life in Ryde, and was probably the oldest member of Court Astim, A.O.F. He was also a Buffalo. The deceased had been in failing health for some time past and gradually sinking. He will be much missed in the town, where he had many friends.

He leaves two sons, a daughter and grandchildren.

The funeral took place at the Cemetery on Thursday, a service being held at Holy Trinity Church, at 2 o'clock which (in addition to the two sons of deceased) was attended by members of the Court of Foresters and R.A.O.B., also by the secretary (Mr. H.
