MR. A. PHILIP -

The death took place suddenly on Saturday, February 16th, of Mr. **Arnold PHILIP**, who was formerly well known in Ryde, where he lived until his retirement in 1926. Mr PHILIP who was 71, commenced his career at the Royal School of Mines and the City of Guilds, gaining the qualification of B.Sc. (London). A.R.S.M., A.R.C.S., A.M.I.E.E., and F.I.C. He became chemist to the Government of India at Coopers Hill and assistant professor of chemistry at Herriott and Watt College, Edinburgh, afterwards becoming professor of chemistry at the Merchant Venturers' College, University of Bristol. In 1900 he was appointed Admiralty chemist at Portsmouth Dockyard. After his retirement he left for London. The remains were brought to Ryde for burial, and Canon S.MORGAN officiated at a requiem mass at St. Mary's Church on Tuesday week. The mourners were: Mr. Aidan PHILIP (son), Miss Cecily and Miss Lucy PHILIP (daughters), and Mr. Lassal PHILIP (nephew). Father O'CALLAGHAN took the service at the interment in Ryde cemetery.
