EX-SERVICE MAN'S DEATH -

The death occurred on Tuesday, at 22 Southfield-gardens, Swanmore, as an outcome of war service, of Mr. **Eric William STONE**, son-in-law of Mr. D.D.PALMER, the school attendance officer.
