THE LATE MR. A. A. BURRELL OF RYDE Radiologist at the County Hospital for 33 years

At one time the only radiologist on the Island, Mr. **Arthur Ambrose BURRELL**, B.A., M.B., Bch., B.A.O., of 30 Melville-street, Ryde, died at his home on Saturday. For 33 years from 1912 Mr. BURRELL was radiologist at the Royal I.W. County Hospital, Ryde. In his 81st year, he had been ill for three weeks.

An Irishman, Mr. BURRELL was born in Kingstown, near Dublin, and qualified at Trinity College, Dublin. Later he was made a Fellow of the Royal College of Medicine. In 1912 he came to England and joined the staff of the County Hospital, where he remained till 1945. The following year he retired from private practice, owing to ill-health. During the first world war he was a captain in the R.A.M.C. (Territorials), and worked as radiologist in the 5th Southern General Hospital at Portsmouth and also the Royal Hospital at Portsmouth. In the 1939-45 war he was consultant for fracture cases and electrical therapy at King Edward VII Convalescent Home for Officers at Osborne House.

A resident of Ryde since leaving Ireland, Mr. BURRELL was the oldest past master of the Ryde Lodge of Freemasons, and a member of the Royal Victoria Yacht Club from 1919 until 1956. He is survived by a widow, their only daughter, and two grandchildren.

The funeral took place on Wednesday, when a service at Holy Trinity Church, Ryde, was conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. H. E. GIBSON). The family mourners were Mrs. R. H. BURRELL (widow), Mrs.. KRUSZYNSKWJ (daughter), and Miss M. BURRELL (sister). The congregation also included representatives of the Island's medical profession. The interment was at Ryde Cemetery.
