Death of Col. E.W. CRADOCK, D.L., J.P.

A gentleman who for many years was prominent in the military and social life of the Island passed away at Glebe House, Chiddingfold, Surrey, on Tuesday, in the person of Col. **Edmund William CRADOCK, D.L., J.P.** Col. CRADOCK, who was in his 86th year, resided for a long period at Ryde, first at The Castle and later at The Lawn, Spencer-road. From 1891 until May 1900, he commanded the 5th (I.W. Rifles) Volunteer Battalion of the Hampshire Regiment, being succeeded by the late Col. Sir Charles Hilton SEELY. Col. CRADOCK was the only son of the late Edmund James CRADOCK, of Knighton Hall, Leicestershire. He served in the Royal Fusiliers in the Afghan War of 1879-80, being mentioned in despatches and gaining the brevet of Major, and he retired with the rank of lieutenant-colonel in 1887. He was a Justice of the Peace for the counties of Hants, Hereford, and Sussex, and a deputy lieutenant of the Island. He first married in 1878 Emily Margaret, only child of Capt. STANFELL, R.N., of Courtfield, Ryde, who died in 1909, and secondly Julia Lucy, second daughter of the late Gen. Sir Samuel BROWNE, V.C., G.C.B., K.C.S.I., of St. John's Park, Ryde. The late colonel was for a time chairman of the committee of the County Hospital and he gave that institution £1000 to endow a bed in memory of his first wife. He was also a generous supporter of the I.W. Rose Society, whose annual exhibitions were sometimes held in the grounds of his residence. He was a member of the Army and Navy, Royal Victoria Yacht, and Royal Automobile Clubs and a fellow of the Zoological Society.

His second wife survives him.

The funeral will take place to-day (Saturday) at Ryde, service at the Parish Church at 12.15 p.m.

FUNERAL OF COL. E.W. CRADOCK, D.L., J.P., AT RYDE.

The remains of Col. **Edmund William CRADOCK, D.L., J.P.**, who for so many years was closely associated with the military and social life of the Island, were brought to Ryde from Chiddingfold

for interment on Saturday. The first part of the service was held at the Parish Church, the Vicar (the Rev. W.N. MARTIN) being assisted by the Rev. E.P. PELLOE (rector of Chiddingfold). The hymns were "My God my Father, while I stray," and "On the resurrection morning," Mr. E. HOWARD, of Chiddingfold, being at the organ. The chief mourners were Col. H. ADDERLEY CRADOCK, Mrs. A.
