THE FUNERAL

...of Mr. **Arthur Claude WHITNEY**, of Bideford, Swanmore-road, whose lamented death was recorded last week, took place on Tuesday, the first part of the service being held in St. James's Church, to which he had given such devoted service as a member of the Church Council and secretary of the Men's Service. The Rev. E.E.M. GREEN (incumbent), who officiated, paid high tribute to deceased's ungrudging services, saying all the members' hearts were full of a deep thankfulness for all he had done. On the arrival of the cortege it was met in the church porch by a guard of honour formed of members of the committee of the Men's Service.

Mr. H.H. LOWER presided at the organ and, whilst the congregation were assembled, played "I know that my Redeemer liveth," He accompanied the singing of hymns "Peace perfect peace," and "On the Resurrection morning," and the chanting of the 23rd Psalm.
