CMDR. (S) H.N. JOLLIFFE, R.N.

The death occurred on Sunday at his home, 3 Yelfs Road, Ryde, of Comdr. (S) **Harry Norman JOLLIFFE**, R.N., of Cowes. At the age of 17 he joined the Royal Navy and went into the Paymaster Branch, later seeing service in most parts of the world. In 1910 he married Miss Mary Cron PATON at Kenilworth, near Capetown, South Africa. He was a member of the association of R.N. Officers. A quiet and home-loving man, he retired from the Navy through ill-health in 1919, after 25 years service, and came to the Island to live. During the last war he served in the Home Guard and afterwards was an A.R.P. warden. He leaves a widow. The funeral took place at Ryde Cemetery yesterday (Wednesday). Canon A. CORY, R.D., officiating. Mourners were Mrs. M.C. JOLLIFFE (widow), Mrs. Frank FISHER (sister-in-law), Mr. MUCKLOW and Mr. and Mrs. REYNOLDS.

DEATH OF COMDR. H. N. JOLLIFFE

The death occurred on Sunday of Comdr. (S) **Harry Norman JOLLIFFE**, R.N. (ret.) of 3 Yelf's-road, aged 72. The son of the late Fleet Engineer Henry JOLLIFFE, of Cowes, one of Queen Victoria's Officers on the Royal Yacht Victoria and Albert, he entered the paymaster branch of the Royal Navy as a young man and remained in the service for 25 years. He married Miss Mary PATON, at Capetown in 1909. Her brother (Mr. Robert PATON) was City Chamberlain of Edinburgh for 30 years. Ill-health caused Comdr. JOLLIFFE to retire prematurely, and he and his wife settled in the Island, living at Cowes and later here. During the last war he insisted on joining the Home Guard, and when his health forced him to resign he became an A.R.P. warden. The funeral took place at Ryde Cemetery on Wednesday, the Vicar (Canon A. CORY, R.D.) officiating. The mourners were Mrs. JOLLIFFE (widow), Mrs. REYNOLDS, and Mr. MUCKLOW. Messrs. J. WHEELER and Son made the arrangements.
