DEATH OF MR. J. A. LEWIS

It is with regret that we record the passing of Mr. **John Alfred LEWIS**, at Newport last week. In early days Mr. LEWIS served the P. and O. Navigation Company as a quartermaster, and later on yachts. While on the P. and O. boat Bokara he was wrecked off the Pessicore Reef, and was one of the fortunate six saved, having been washed on the rocks. Returning to Ryde, he joined the pier staff as a porter, and was employed there for 20 or 30 years, leaving in 1918, when he became a painter. His wife predeceased him about 10 years ago. The funeral at the cemetery on Monday was conducted by the Rev. E. WILLIAMSON (of the Newport-street Methodist Church). The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. J. LEWIS (brother and sister-in-law), Mrs. THORNE (niece), Mrs. WILLIAMS, Mrs. F. and Mrs. R. LAKE, Mr. McVINISH, Mr. S. ORCHARD, Mr. ALEXANDER, Mr. PERKIS, Miss SNOW, and Mrs. SCRATTON.
