### FUNERAL OF COL. ROWLAND

The funeral of Col. **Thomas ROWLAND**, who died on Thursday of last week at No. 7 West-street, took place at midday on Monday. Deceased was a C.B. and late Colonel of the 5<sup>th</sup> Batt. Northumberland Fusiliers. The first part of the service was taken at St. James's Church, where the body was met by the churchwardens, the incumbent officiating. The hymns "Peace perfect peace," and "Now the labourer's task is o'er," were sung by the choir, and as the body left the church the "Dead March" in *Saul* was played by the organist. The principal mourners Mrs. TYLER (daughter), Col. H.E. TYLER, R.E. (son-in-law), Col. W.H. ROWLAND (brother), Mrs. W.H. and Mrs. G. ROWLAND (sisters-in-law) and Mr. and Mrs. HOOPER. Amongst others at the church were Capt. FANE, Col. MURRAY, Mr. H. PAXTON, Mr. Claude E. SMITH, Mr. F. GRACE, Mrs. W. WATTS, and Mrs. HARMSWORTH. The interment took place in a brick grave at the Cemetery. Choice floral tributes were sent by his daughter, Col. TYLER, Col. And Mrs. W.H. ROWLAND, Mrs. George ROWLAND, Miss May ROWLAND, and Mr. and Mrs. HOOPER. The outer casket was of dull polished English oak, with raised lid and handsome brass fittings, the breast-plate bearing the inscription: Thomas ROWLAND, C.B., died 10<sup>th</sup> December, 1914, aged 83 years." The funeral arrangements were carried out by Messrs. PURNELL and PURNELL.
