DEATH AND FUNERAL OF MRS. **E.BLAKE** –

Widespread regret is felt at the death of Mrs. **Elizabeth BLAKE**, the highly esteemed wife of Mr. J. Vickers BLAKE, the well known veterinary surgeon, which occurred at her residence in Monkton-street on Monday at the advanced age of 81 years. Mrs. BLAKE passed peacefully away after a short illness, and her loss is keenly felt by a large circle of friends who greatly sympathise with Mr. BLAKE, and his family in their bereavement. The late Mrs. BLAKE was born in Liverpool, but she had spent over half a century in Ryde since her marriage to Mr. BLAKE, who has to be regarded as one of the Island's "grand old men," being still in active practice long after passing the allotted span. The funeral took place on Thursday, the Rev. Noel H.STUBBS (vicar) conducting the first part of the service at Holy Trinity Church. The family mourners were Mr. J. Cowper BLAKE, M.R.C.V.S. (Newport), Messrs. Harry, Harold, and A.BLAKE (sons). Others present were Messrs. T. and F.SHEPPARD (employees), the Deputy-Mayor (Mr. Rowland R.RUSSELL), Messrs. A.H.OSBORNE, A.E.BARTON, P. and C.LANGDON, S.ATTWOOD, A.A.HOLLAND, J.JOHNCOX, and Mrs. WYLES. The interment took place at the Cemetery, and among the floral tributes was one from the staff at Messrs. PACK, Union-street. The funeral arrangements were nicely carried out by Messrs. PURNELL.
