### IN MEMORIUM

Another old and respected inhabitant of Ryde has passed away. We allude to Mr. Alderman **Joseph PAUL**, F.R.G.S., who died rather suddenly early on Friday morning last, at the age of 73. The deceased gentleman was well known as having taken an active part in the government of the town and borough, having been a member of the old board of Commissioners, of which body he for

a time occupied the chair. Had he enjoyed more robust health, and his life been prolonged, additional Municipal honours might have awaited him; but he has gone to his grave followed by the respect of not a few. Mr. PAUL was well known in the scholastic world, and many of the pupils at Ormonde House have left Ryde to enter upon important public and private engagements, after receiving a high-class education. The removal of Mr. PAUL will, of course, cause a vacancy on the Aldermanic Bench, and as his term of office would not have expired until November 9<sup>th</sup> 1883, the Council will elect a successor.
