SUDDEN DEATH OF MR. H. DURRANT

It is with sincere regret that we record the death of Mr. **Henry DURRANT**, which occurred at his home in George-street with painful suddenness on Thursday afternoon, after some months of failing health. The deceased (a son of Mr. DURRANT of Maidenhead, who for several years held the Mayoralty of that town), came to Ryde 41 years ago, when he entered into business as a hosier with Mr. SIBLEY in Cross-street. Later he opened up a similar business in Union-street, from which he retired some two years ago. The deceased who was a prominent Freemason, was 70 years of age. He leaves a widow to whom we are sure every sympathy will be extended in her sad and sudden bereavement.

FUNERAL OF MR. HENRY DURRANT

The funeral of Mr. **Henry DURRANT**, of George-street, whose sudden death was recorded last week, took place on Monday. The first portion of the obsequies was conducted at St. Thomas's Church, the Rev. C.L. BLAKE officiating. The chief mourners were Mrs. NOKE (sister), Mr. T. DURRANT (brother), Miss DURRANT (niece), Mr. LANE (brother-in-law), Mr. Norman SMITH, Mr. E.W. WILKINS, and Mr. R. COLENUTT.

Many of the deceased gentleman's near relatives were prevented from being present owing to military duties. Amongst those present at the church and graveside were the Mayor (MR. John I. The inscription on the breastplate of the coffin was "Henry DURRANT, died 5th Nov., 1914, aged 70 years." Mr. Henry DURRANT, who came to Ryde 41 years ago, was a son of Mr. DURRANT, of Maidenfield, who for several years held the Mayoralty of that town.
