

MAJOR-GENERAL JAMES LANGFORD PEARSE

HART'S ANNUAL ARMY LIST, MILITIA LIST, AND IMPERIAL LIST

Major-General **J.L. PEARSE** commanded a detachment sent in pursuit of the Cuddapah district rebels under Ursimah Reddy in 1846, and subsequently when a field force was formed for the suppression of the insurrection performed the duties of Staff Officer until it was broken up. Joined the 5th Madras Native Infantry in December 1852 during the Burmese war and served with it till May 1853 (Medal with Clasp for Pegu).
