#### THE FUNERAL OF SURGEON-GENERAL SAUNDERS

The General who died on Sunday, after a long illness, took place at the Cemetery on Thursday, the Revs. RUTHERFORD and T.W. FAIR officiating. The body was enclosed in a polished oak coffin, with heavy brass mountings, which bore the inscription:- "Surgeon-General George SAUNDERS, born 27<sup>th</sup> December 1819, died 7<sup>th</sup> January 1894." The mourners included Mr. SAUNDERS (brother), Capt. MENZIES, Surgeon-General ROSS, and the servants.

There were some lovely flowers from General W.M.LEES and family, Barbara MENZIES, Miss HUNTINGFORD, "Robert and Millie," "Lucy," "Edith," Mrs. F. Dale PAWLE, Mrs. and the Misses PURCELL, "George and Rene" (grandchildren), "Ella," Mrs. And Miss WOODFORD, Mrs. Arthur C. CROOKSHANK, Mrs. William E, WARDEN, and Mrs. Shaw PHILLIPS, and the servants.

The funeral cortege consisted of an open hearse, drawn by four horses, and several carriages. Mr. HANSFORD had charge of the arrangements.
