DEATH OF MR. A.E. BARTON, C.C.

We regret to announce the death of Mr. **Albert Edward BARTON**, of The Elms, Partlands-avenue, which took place at the County Hospital early on Tuesday morning. Mr. BARTON, who was 57 years of age, was out and about in the town as usual a week before his death, which was due to pleurisy and pneumonia. Mr. BARTON came of a well known family which has given much valued service to the town in a public capacity. His father, the late Mr. Isaac BARTON, was Mayor of the borough for two years, and deceased's brother, the late Mr. John I. BARTON, was Mayor for six years in succession. Mr. BARTON has represented the north-western division on the County Council since 1931, when he defeated Mr. Arthur HILL at the poll. By his death the County Hospital loses its most frequent visitor. There was no work which he loved or took a greater interest in than in promoting the welfare of the hospital. His daily visits were welcomed by the patients and staff, to whom he made gifts of confectionary, and he occasionally took those in the convalescent stage for motor rides. For many years he was a member of the Management Committee of the hospital. In earlier life Mr. BARTON was a fine athlete and one of the fastest wing players the old Ryde Football Club ever had. He was partnered by "Johnny" WILLIAMS in the Ryde Rovers' team, which included such good players as Clyde PURNELL and the brothers SAUNDERS, as

when they beat Ryde's professional team, and afterwards assisted the Reds when they reverted to amateurism. By profession he was a surveyor and engineer, and after holding an appointment as assistant to the West Bromwich Borough Council he was for 17 years the surveyor to the East Cowes District Council, and resigned in 1919. In recent years he has been a co-partner with his sister, Miss L. BARTON, of Bellevue Garage, East-street. Mr. BARTON will be much missed in the town, where he had many friends. He was a former member of the Ryde Conservative Club, and connected at different times with the Golf Club, Bowling Club, and the Ryde Club. Much sympathy is felt with the relatives. The funeral takes place to-day (Saturday), the first part of the service being held at the Parish Church.
