DEATH OF COL. CAREY

The death occurred at Melmoth Lodge, Ryde, on Dec 20, of Col. **Clement E Beauvoir CAREY**, late Royal Engineers, who had been an invalid for many years but who took a keen interest in everything connected with Ryde and affairs generally. He was born on March 27, 1843, and obtained a commission in the R.Es. in December 1860. He served in the Egyptian War of 1882, having two medals and clasp, was twice mentioned in despatches, and obtained a brevet majority. He married in 1868 Emily Cecil, second daughter of the late William Talbot AGAR, of Milford House, near Lymington.

The funeral took place at Holy Trinity Church the service being choral. The officiating clergy were the Vicar of Ryde (the Rev. Hugh DE FLEMING), Canon SHEARME, the Rev. C.L. BLAKE (Vicar of St. John's), and the Rev. Norman GRAY (curate of Holy Trinity). Canon SHEARME read the lesson, and the hymns were "On the resurrection morning" and "Now the labourers task is o'er." The mourners were the Misses CAREY (2) Col. VON DONOP (late R.E. Aldershot Command), and Mr. Percy THELLUSSON, J.P. Among those present at the church were General FETHERSTONHAUGH, C.B., Major General BEKER, Col. E.W. CRADOCK, D.L., J.P.,

and Mrs. CRADOCK, Capt. J. MEARES, Mr. G.P. QUALE, Mr. VOSEY, Mr. Arthur WOODS, Mr. Edward CARTER, J.P., and Mrs. CARTER, Dr. HORSBURGH, Dr. SPENCER-CHURCHILL, Mr. W.R. TAYLOR J.P., Mr. W. HOPGOOD, and Mr. J. JOHNCOX. The funeral was carried out by Messrs. PURNELL and PURNELL.
