CORONER'S INQUEST

An inquest was held at the Strand Tavern on Wednesday evening before F. BLAKE Esq., coroner, on the body of **Charles WOODFORD**, 40 years of age, who has been found dead in his bed by his wife Ann WOODFORD, about 4 o'clock on Tuesday morning. It was proved he had been in the Royal Navy, and had been discharged from Haslar Hospital in consequence of suffering from disease of the heart. After the testimony of Mr. A. WOODWARD, surgeon, the jury had no hesitation in coming to a verdict, "that the deceased died by visitation of God from natural causes."
