DEATH FROM A COUGH

The death has been reported to the Coroner of Mrs. **Harriet Fanny DENNETT**, 77 years of age, of 38 Monkton-street. On Tuesday evening deceased retired as usual at 10.15, but later on experienced a fit of coughing from which she lay back as if exhausted, and expired directly afterwards. Deceased had been medically attended for the past four years for weakness of the heart, and it is thought that death was due to heart failure, brought on by coughing. It is unlikely that an inquest will result.
