## FUNERAL OF A YOUNG SOLDIER -

The death of Pte. George Edgar William PHILLIPS took place at Folkestone in hospital, on Monday, after a short illness, at the age of 18. The young soldier had only joined up 17 days before his death; he was in the employ of Messrs. LOCKE & Sons of High-street. The funeral took place on Saturday at Ryde, and was of a Military character; the coffin covered with the Union Jack, being borne on a gun carriage drawn by two horses to the Primitive Methodist Church at the top of High-street, where the service was conducted by the Rev W.
