### THE FUNERAL

...of Mrs. **Rose BEVES**, of 3 Weeks-road, took place on Tuesday. The Rev. T. COLLIER officiated, and the All Saint's Mother's Union, of which the deceased was the oldest member, and the woman's section of the British Legion attended the service in the Parish Church.
