DEATH OF MR. H. S. JONES

The death took place on Monday of Mr. **Henry Samuel JONES**, of 44 Weeks-road. Deceased, who was a well-known member of the community, passed away in his 80th year after much suffering borne uncomplainingly and with great patience. His death closes a life of great usefulness and ends a period of citizenship of much worth. Those associated with the United Methodist Church will feel his loss most keenly for Mr. JONES had been connected with that denomination for 55 years. In every phase of that church's life he was a conspicuous figure, and he gave all he had to give for the advancement of its influence and welfare. In addition to being the oldest trustee he was for 25 years superintendent of the Sunday-school, an officer of the Band of Hope, and a circuit steward. Throughout his long membership he worked devotedly on its behalf and was held in the highest esteem by everyone. He was also one of the most capable piano removers in the Island. He was twice married and leaves one son. His second wife predeceased him about eight years ago.

The funeral took place on Wednesday, the first part of the service being held at the United Methodist Church. The Rev. R. TROLLEY officiated and in the course of an address said the deceased was loved and respected for his high Christian character and for his devotion to Jesus Christ and His Church. Deceased loved his fellowship and his worship in the church which he had served splendidly with loyalty and devotion for so many years. Mr. R. LAKE was at the organ and deceased's favourite hymn "Sleep on, beloved, and take thy rest," was sung, the organist playing "O rest in the Lord" while the remains were taken from the church for interment at the cemetery.

Among the collection of flowers were floral tributes from members of the church and the circuit stewards. Mr. O. PERKIS was the undertaker.
