GROCER'S SUDDEN DEATH –

The death occurred at the Royal I.W. County Hospital on Sunday a few hours after being taken ill at his home, 17 George-street, of Mr. **James Edward TIMS**, aged 64. Mr. TIMS was born in Croydon, but had spent most of his life in the Island, and for more than 30 years, until his retirement 18 months ago, ran a grocery and provision business in West-street. He was a life member of the Vectis Boating and Fishing Club. The funeral service took place at Holy Trinity Church on Tuesday, the Vicar (the Rev. H.E.GIBSON) officiating.
