**OLD TOWNSMAN'S DEATH**

With much regret we have to announce the death of an old inhabitant of Ryde and one of the town's leading tradesmen, Mr. **William TEAGUE**, which occurred at his residence, Woodside, St. John's Park, on Wednesday. Mr. TEAGUE, who was 58 years of age, had been in poor health for a considerable time as the result of a seizure. Lately he had seemingly improved and was able to enjoy walking about on the pier. He had another attack, however, which proved fatal. Mr. TEAGUE was very well known and highly respected in the town. For upwards of 35 years he had been in business in Union-street. Something like thirty years ago he became organist at St. James' Church, a position he relinquished after thirteen years, to be come organist at St. Thomas' Church which post he held for seventeen years. Of a genial and kindly disposition his illness was learned with much regret, but it was hoped that he might be spared for some years. He leaves a widow and ten children for whom his fellow townsmen will feel every sympathy in their sad loss. The funeral will be tomorrow (Saturday) afternoon, St. Thomas' Church at three o'clock.

### DEATH OF MR. W. TEAGUE

It is with deep regret we record the death of Mr. **William TEAGUE**, which took place on Wednesday at his residence, Woodside, St. John's park. Mr. TEAGUE had for some time been suffering from the effects of a stroke, but only recently he was able to be about town again, and his many friends were congratulating him on his recovery, so the news of his death came as a great shock. Mr. TEAGUE had been in business in Union-street as a pianoforte and music seller for 35 years, and his death removes one of the best known figures in town.

He was at one time organist at Binstead Church, for 18 years he acted in that capacity at St. James; Church, and later for 17 years at St. Thomas' Church, Ryde. An accomplished musician, a courteous and genial gentleman, he will be greatly missed by his fellow townsmen. Mr. TEAGUE was 57 years of age. The greatest sympathy is felt for Mrs. TEAGUE and the family of 10 children in their bereavement. The funeral took place on Saturday afternoon, the first part of the service at St. Thomas's Church. There was a large attendance, including members of the Y.M.C.A., the late Mr. TEAGUE having always taken a keen interest in this association.
