**EXTON:** On the 1<sup>st</sup> inst., at Brunswick-place, Ryde, after a long illness, which was borne with Christian fortitude, Mr. **Joseph EXTON**, landlord of The Lamb Inn, aged 66.

Part of a little cluster of pubs at this end of Station (formerly Brunswick) street, it opened in the mid 19<sup>th</sup> century and closed in 1923. Joseph EXTON brewed beer here from 1855 in one of Ryde's smallest pub breweries. Following a car crashing into the front of the building, extensive renovation has taken place and it is no longer recognisable as a pub. It was situated next door to the larger Eagle.
