THE LATE MR. EDMUND RICKARD

We regret to record the death of Mr. **E. RICKARD**, who has carried on for many years the business of a watchmaker and jeweller in the High Street. Mr. RICKARD had been rather unwell of late, but the end came somewhat suddenly and unexpectedly on Friday morning last. Although Mr. RICKARD had never taken an active part in public affairs he took great interest in them, and always supported movements which he considered likely to benefit the town. The esteem and respect in which he was universally held were shown at the funeral, which took place on Tuesday last, when an unusually large number of floral tributes attested the sympathy of the inhabitants with the bereaved family.

The mourners on the occasion were: the Misses Minnie, Ethel and Lottie RICKARD, (daughters); Messrs. Joseph, Alfred and William RICKARD, (sons); Messrs. Edward and Joseph RICKARD, (relatives); Mr. A. HOLMES (executor); Messrs. BARNES, HOSKINS and J. DUFFETT, sea. The service was taken at the Cemetery by the Rev. LAWSON, Wesleyan minister, and amongst others who attended at the cemetery were Messrs. H. ADAMS, S. FOWLER, J.P., H. POLLARD, J.P., W. SMITH, LOADER, A. TEAGUE, TURLE, RIDDETT, GIBSON, JACKMAN, RASHLEY, DUFFETT, jun., Rev. H. COLEY, Mrs. W. SMITH, Mrs. WOOD and the employees of the deceased. The coffin was of polished oak with raised lid and brass mountings, the plate bearing the engraved inscription "Edmund RICKARD. Died November 7th, 1902. Aged 64 years."
