THE WRECK OF THE SAILING SHIP "IREX" -below a brief section of the County Press report of 1st Feb 1890 states:-

.... a coastguard named MAYO at once descended the cliff but only arrived at the bottom in time to see the rope freed by the combined energies of the workers at the top. This result did not however, make his gallant attempt any the less brilliant.......
