The War Toll Locally

Mr. and Mrs. SANGER of 45 the Strand, Ryde, have received a wire from the War Office that their son, 2nd Lieut T. R. SANGER, 1/5 B Company South Staffordshire Regiment, B.E.F., is missing, the message following that of a previous one a week earlier stating that he was wounded.

Mr. SANGER had a very successful scholastic career at the Upper Grade and the Sandown Secondary School, and after leaving college he obtained a teaching appointment at Walsall, from which place he joined up on the outbreak of war. After being in France for 10 months he was sent on with his regiment to Africa, but it was recalled and it was during this period that he received his commission. Mr. SANGER was home in the early part of the year and returned to France on May 8th.
