DEATH AND FUNERAL OF MR. W. RAYNER

The death took place very suddenly at Hughenden, St. John's-road, on Saturday of Mr. William RAYNER, a popular member of the Buffaloes. The deceased, who was a bachelor, was 49, and the circumstances of his death were very sad.
