## **DEATH OF MRS. J. D. DAVIES**

We regret to record the death of Mrs. Eleanor Mary DAVIES, wife of Dr. James D. DAVIES. of Grosvenor Lodge, Queen's-road, which took place on Tuesday, in her 74<sup>th</sup> year. By her passing the town has lost one of its most esteemed residents. A daughter of the late Mr. Frederick COBB, of The Cottage, Frensham, Mrs. DAVIES led a guiet and retired life except during the war, when her services were whole-heartedly given to the work of the war depot in the town. She spent a great deal of her early life at Oporto, Portugal, and came here to live 45 years ago. Amongst her intimate friends she was greatly beloved for her quiet charm and gentleness. Ten years ago she lost her only son, and six years later she suffered a further heavy bereavement by the death of her elder daughter. She is survived by her husband, whose name has been inseparably linked with that of the town for many years, and one daughter, with whom the deepest sympathy is felt. The funeral took place yesterday (Friday), the first part of the service being held in the Parish Church. The Vicar (Canon MOXON) officiated, assisted by the Rev. N. H. STUBBS (Rector of Bishop's Waltham), formerly Vicar of Holy Trinity, and the Rev. E. J. FORSE. The men's choir attended with Mr. E. G. WELSH at the organ, and following the chanting of Psalm 23, led the singing of the hymns "My God, my Father, while I stray" and "O strength and stay, upholding all creation."
